

Sayyid Al-Hakeem Meets Tribal Sheikhs, Dignitaries from Bani Tamim, Al-Taji, Northern Baghdad: Sectarianism Is Political, Not Social



His Eminence, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, met with a group of sheikhs and dignitaries from the esteemed Bani Tamim tribe, along with several sheikhs and dignitaries from Al-Taji district and northern Baghdad, at Bani Tamim tribal guesthouse hosted by Sheikh Muslih Al-Zgem.
