
## Sayyid Al-Hakeem congratulates Iraqi Police over founding anniversary, calls to grant them lands, adjust payrolls



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of Al-Hikma National Movement, met with Lieutenant General Abdulameer Al-Shimmari, the Minister of Interior, and extended congratulations and best wishes to him and, through him, to the dedicated personnel of the Ministry of Interior on the occasion of Iraqi Police Day.
