

Sayyid Al-Hakeem: Most talk about corruption stems from political scapegoating and targeting the Iraqi experience



The guest place of Al-Fatla tribe of Sheikh Hadi Al Hasan Al-Fatlawi, was one of the significant stops during Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of Al-Hikma National Movement, in Babylon province. H.E. recalled pivotal moments in Iraq's history, confronting dictatorship and building the Iraqi experience, noting the political landscape's developments and the regional and international shifts in perception of the Iraqi situation.
