In the guest place of Beni Hajim tribes, the clan of Al Bu Hassan, at the residence of Sheikh Musheer Jafar Al-Hameez, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of Al-Hikma National Movement, met with a group of Sheiks and dignitaries from Al-Rumaytha tribes.
