

Sayyid Al-Hakeem affirms Developing Curricula to enhance students' critical thinking, practical skills, independent character development



On the first day of the new academic year, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers' Alliance, visited several schools in Al-Karkh district of Baghdad to extend congratulations on the school year's commencement. His Eminence encouraged students to contribute positively to themselves, their families, and their country.

H.E. urged that the teaching community be given privileges commensurate with their contributions, including land allocations. Lastly, H.E. encouraged remembrance of the students in Palestine, Lebanon, and all nations suffering from the destruction of their educational institutions and schools due to the Israeli occupation.
