Sayyid Al-Hakeem Visits Nawroli Tribe Sheikh in Halabja, Stresses Honoring Halabja's People



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, visited the guesthouse of Sheikh Tahseen, leader of the Nawroli tribe, where he met with esteemed members. His Eminence expressed his deep appreciation for the opportunity to connect with the noble tribe and the people of Kurdistan, emphasizing the profound historical relationship between Arabs and Kurds. This bond, H.E. noted, has been marked by significant milestones, including the legacy of Imam Sayyid Mohsen Al-Hakeem (may Allah sanctify his soul) and the contributions of the late Martyr Al-Mihrab and Aziz Al-Iraq (may Allah sanctify his soul).

He stressed that the best way to honor the city's residents is for the Iraqi Parliament to vote in favor of recognizing Halabja as a governorate. H.E. added that the related legislation awaits only the final step of parliamentary approval, expressing hope that this decision will be finalized before March 16, the anniversary of the tragic event.
