Sayyid Al-Hakeem at Iftar Banquet with Martyrs' Families: Sacrifices Restored Iraq to Its People



During an iftar banquet held in honor of martyrs' families, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, expressed deep appreciation for the sacrifices made by the martyrs and their loved ones.
