

Sayyid Al-Hakeem's Visit to Salah Al-Din Underscores Resolving Displacement File Urgency to Reinforce National Unity



During a press conference held at the Salah Al-Din Governorate headquarters following his meeting with local government officials, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers' Alliance, affirmed that the visit aimed to explore both the province's challenges and its success stories. In particular, he criticized the "50% + 1" formula, describing it as an obstacle to sustainable development.

In closing, Sayyid Al-Hakeem renewed his call to resolve the issue of displaced persons and to settle internal disputes within the framework of a united nation—one that embraces all Iraqis and lays the foundation for a stable and prosperous future.
