Sayyid Al-Hakeem from Anbar: We Honor Its People's Sacrifices and Call for National Unity and Rejection of Sectarianism



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers' Alliance, visited the guesthouse of the Albu Jleib tribe, hosted by Sheikh Ahmad Aboud Al-'Ayada, where H.E. met with a gathering of sheiks and dignitaries from Anbar Province.
