Sayyid Al-Hakeem: Baghdad's Arab SummitShowcased Iraq's Positive Image, Calls to Prepare for Upcoming Milestones



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers' Alliance, stated during the regular meeting of Al-Hikma's Advisory Council that hosting the Arab Summit in Baghdad was a significant achievement and a positive message reflecting Iraq's new reality of security stability and progress in services and urban development.
