

Sayyid Al-Hakeem Meets Patriarch Louis Sako, Stresses Positive Coexistence, Inclusive Political Representation Importance



Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, met with His Beatitude Patriarch Mar Louis Raphael I Sako, Patriarch of the Chaldean Catholic Church in Iraq and around the world, to discuss key issues related to diversity management, the rights of Iraq's components, and their political and national entitlements.
